Is there a time to quit a disease modifying therapy in multiple sclerosis patients?

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Andreas Lutterotti is assistant professor for "Experimental Therapy Research in Multiple Sclerosis and other Neurological Diseases" at the University of Zurich since August 2014, as well as a senior physician at the Department of Neurology, University Hospital Zurich. He earned his medical doctor's degree at the Medical University of Innsbruck where he thereafter worked as PostDoc and resident in the Clinical Department of Neurology. During this time, he pursued an Alexander von Humboldt fellowship at the Institute of Neuroimmunology and Clinical Multiple Sclerosis Research in Hamburg. In 2012 he received his board certification in Neurology. His core scientific focus is the development and implementation of experimental therapies in the field of multiple sclerosis and other autoimmune diseases. His research is supported by the UZH CRPP MS, the Wyss Translational Center Zurich and the Swiss MS Society.
